THE 22d Instant her Majesty went to Ismoyloff, but is not in the Palace, being incamped with all her Court near the Park of that Place, which is about three Miles from hence.

Berlin, July 28, N.S. By Letters which came in this Morning from Konigsberg of the 24th Instant, we learn, that his Prussian Majesty was to leave that Place the next Morning very early, and that he will be here on the 30th Instant. On the 15th or 16th of next Month, an Election will be made at Sonnebourg of a Grand Master of the Order of the Knights of St. John, for the District of Brandenburg, in the Room of the late Margrave Albert, and it is said the Choice will fall upon his Son the present Margrave Charles. At the same Time Count Finkenfein, formerly Governour to the Prince Royal, will be put in Possession of the Commandery vacant by the Death of M. Cnyphausen. A great Number of new Knights will also be created on this Occasion, amongst whom will be General Ginkel and Colonel Polentz, the Dutch and Saxon Ministers. Apartments are getting ready at the Castle for the Reception of the Margrave and Margravine of Anspach, who are expected here about the Middle of next Month: 'Tis said also, that the Dutchess of Meiningen, his Prussian Majesty's Aunt, will be here about that Time.

Cassel, July 30, N. S. On the 28th a Courier arrived here from Warnemund near Rostock, with advice of his Swedish Majesty's landing there on the 25th Instant. The next Morning Prince William set out from hence to meet his Majesty at a Houle of General Ditforts, not far from Rintel; and it is expected his Majesty will reach this Place by Saturday or Sunday next.

HIS Majesty's Plate of One Hundred Guineas will be Run for on Monday the 6th Day of September next, on the Round Course the South Side of Lincoln, by any Horse, Mare, or Gelding, being no more than six Years Old the Grass before, as must be certified under the Hands of the Breeder; carrying 12 Stone, three Heats; to be shewn and enter'd at Mr. Tho. Gray's at Waddington, on Saturday in the Evening before they run; and if any Difference arises, either by Betting or Running, the same to be determined by his Grace the Duke of Ancafter, or whom he shall appoint, according to such his Majesty's Orders as will be then produced. On Tuesday the 7th Day of September will be run for on the same Course, by Gallows, a Plate of Twenty Pounds Value, and a Five Pound Plate for the second Horse, by any Horse, &c. 14 Hands, to carry nine Stone, above or under Weight in Proportion, Inch and half Stone; Subscribers to pay one Guinea Entrance, Non-Subscribers three: Not to be run for except three Horses enter.
