*Moscow, July 5, O. S.*

**T**HE 28th of last Month in the Evening the Empress came to Town from her Camp near Ismoyloff, and Yesterday she incamped with all her Court, and the three Regiments of the Guards, just out of Town, near a vast Wooden House her Majesty is building, which will contain near 300 Chambers. It is said Major Biron, the Great Chamberlain's Brother, will soon be married to the Daughter of the deceased Prince Menzikoff, to whom her Majesty has returned several Estates her Father had. The six Battallions of the Guards that had Orders to hold themselves in Readiness to march from hence for St. Petersbourg the 5th, 10th and 15th Instant, are not to march from hence till the latter End of next Month. This Change makes some believe her Majesty's Journey to that Place may be also put off, as it was last Year.

*Berlin, Aug. 4, N. S.* On Monday last the King of Prussia returned hither from visiting his Prussian Dominions; the next Day arrived also the General's Seckendorff, Gromkowitz, Ginkel, and Colonel Polentz, who had accompanied his Majesty in that Journey. On Wednesday last a Messenger came from Custrin, with an Account, that his Royal Highness the Prince was extremely ill of a Fever. His Prussian Majesty is a little indisposed of the Gout since Yesterday. On Wednesday last died here Lieutenant General Schulenburg.

*Berlin, Aug. 7, N. S.* The King of Prussia's Fit of the Gout has not yet left him; however he designs to go To-morrow to Potsdam, the Air of that Place agreeing better with his

Majesty than that of Berlin. The Prince Royal is almost quite recovered of his late Indisposition.

*Berlin, Aug. 11, N. S.* On Wednesday last the King of Prussia went to Potsdam. The Evening before his Majesty conferred on the Prince of Bareith the Command of the Regiment of Dragoons vacant by the Death of Lieutenant General Schulenburg. The Prince went Yesterday to Potsdam by his Prussian Majesty's Appointment; and it is said, that soon after the King's Return to Town, which will be in a Couple of Days, the Prince is to go to his Regiment, Orders having already been given for proper and convenient Quarters to be prepared for him. Prince Augustus, his Prussian Majesty's youngest Son, is appointed Stadthouder of Pomerania, in the Room of the late Margrave Albert.

*Cassel, Aug. 13, N. S.* On Saturday the 11th Instant, about Six in the Evening, his Swedish Majesty made his Entry into this Place, being met about half a League off by the Commandant and a great Number of Officers on Horseback, who preceded his Majesty into Town, the Streets being lined on both Sides by the three Regiments in Garrison here, from the Gate through which his Majesty made his Entrance to the Palace. After a triple Discharge of all the Artillery upon the Ramparts, the Regiments marched by his Majesty, and having retaken their Posts, made three Discharges of their Fire-Arms. There were many Triumphant Arches erected on this Occasion, and an incredible Concourse of People, who had flocked from all Parts, as well to partake in the Rejoycings, as to be Spectators of the magnificent Illuminations, Fireworks, &c. prepared for this Purpose; amongst which, those
