IS Pruffian Majefty came to Town this Morning from Potsdam, and this Evening he fets out for Sonnebourg, whither all the Foreign Minifters are invited, and the principal Perfons of Diffinction of this Place are already gone, to be prefent at the Ceremony of the Election of a Grand Master of the Order of St. John, which comes on To-morrow. The new Knights are likewife to be created Tomorrow. The King of Pruffia goes through Cuftrin in his Way to Sonnebourg. Colo-nel Kalkenftein, formerly Sub-Governour to the Prince Royal, is appointed to go to the Court of Cassel, to compliment his Swedish Majesty on the Part of the King of Prussia, upon his safe Arrival in his German Dominions.

Hague, Aug. 24, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland are allembled; but the great Penfionary being difabled by the Gout, cannot attend them. The Deputies of the Province of Zealand, who were lately here, and went back to acquaint their Principals with what paffed in their Conferences with the Deputies of the States General about the new Tariff or Duties on Goods imported or exported, are expected here again in a Day or two. The Prince of Naffau Orange fets out from hence To-morrow for Frile-land; propofing to take upon him the Stadholdership of that Province and of Groeningen upon his coming to the Age of 21 Years, which will be on the 1st of September next. That Prince has taken his Leave of the fe-

veral Colleges of this Government, and of the greatest Part of the Persons of Distin-ction here. Soon after his Arrival at Leuwarden, the Princefs his Mother will fet out to make a Vilit to her Brother the King of Sweden at Caffel. Baron Spar arrived here two Days ago, and defigns to proceed next Monday on his Journey to Caffel, to attend the King of Sweden his Mafter.
