**H**IS Prussian Majesty came to Town this Morning from Potsdam, and this Evening he sets out for Sonnebourg, whither all the Foreign Ministers are invited, and the principal Persons of Distinction of this Place are already gone, to be present at the Ceremony of the Election of a Grand Master of the Order of St. John, which comes on To-morrow. The new Knights are likewise to be created To-morrow. The King of Prussia goes through Custrin in his Way to Sonnebourg. Colonel Kalkenstein, formerly Sub-Governour to the Prince Royal, is appointed to go to the Court of Cassel, to compliment his Swedish Majesty on the Part of the King of Prussia, upon his safe Arrival in his German Dominions.

*Hague, Aug. 24, N. S.* The States of the Province of Holland are assembled; but the great Pensionary being disabled by the Gout, cannot attend them. The Deputies of the Province of Zealand, who were lately here, and went back to acquaint their Principals with what passed in their Conferences with the Deputies of the States General about the new Tariff or Duties on Goods imported or exported, are expected here again in a Day or two. The Prince of Nassau Orange sets out from hence To-morrow for Friseland; proposing to take upon him the Stadholdership of that Province and of Groeningen upon his coming to the Age of 21 Years, which will be on the 1st of September next. That Prince has taken his Leave of the fe-

veral Colleges of this Government, and of the greatest Part of the Persons of Distinction here. Soon after his Arrival at Leuwarden, the Princess his Mother will set out to make a Visit to her Brother the King of Sweden at Cassel. Baron Spar arrived here two Days ago, and designs to proceed next Monday on his Journey to Cassel, to attend the King of Sweden his Master.
