Vienna, August 29.

YESTERDAY being the Anniversary of the Empress's Birth-day, when she entered into the 41st Year of her Age, it was celebrated at Court with great Magnificence. The Elector of Mentz having notified his Design to come hither by the 6th of next Month, the Ceremonial for his Reception is settled.

Copenhagen, Sept. 1. The 29th past, being the Birth-day of the Princess Sophia-Hedwig, the King's Aunt, who then entered into the 55th Year of her Age, the Principal Lords and Ladies of the Court repaired to Friedensbourg to pay their Compliments: Mourning was laid aside that Day. M. de Biedersee, Minister from the King of Prussia, has had an Audience of Leave of his Danish Majesty, and is preparing to return to Berlin.

Cassel, Sept. 3. The King of Sweden, accompanied by the Landgrave of Hesse-Darmstadt, and several other Prin-

ces and Lords, took a Review a few Days ago of Four Regiments of Foot, and Three of Horse. It is said his Swedish Majesty will set out To-morrow for Marburg; but it is yet uncertain whether he will go to use the Waters of Slangenbad. General Count Seckendorff is arrived here from Berlin.

Hague, Sept. 11, N. S. An Assembly of the States of the Province of Holland will be held To-morrow. Their great Pensionary being perfectly free from his usual Indisposition of the Gout, will attend them. An extraordinary Deputation from Zealand, and the Commissaries of the several Chambers of Admiralty, are expected here before the said Assembly breaks up. Yesterday a Collection was made throughout the Province of Holland, and the like will be made in the other Provinces, for the Relief of the poor Vaudois, who have been obliged to leave their native Country on Account of Religion. The Duke of Lorrain is expected here very soon. Our Advices from Brussels say, he designs to set out from thence for these Provinces

on the 17th Instant. Count Golofkin, Son of the Great Chancellour of Russia, is expected here next Month, with the Character of Ambassadour from the Czarina to their High Mightinesses. On the 4th of this Month, the Prince of Nassau-Orange was, with the usual Ceremonies, installed at Leuwarden, and put into Possession of the Dignity of Stadholder and Captain General of the Province of Friseland.
