Hague, September 14, N. S.

THE States of the Province of Holland continue assembled, and have begun to Day to dispose of the vacant Civil and Military Employments that are in their Gift. The Command of the Regiment which the deceased Margrave Albert had, is conferred upon the Prince his Son, in whose Favour the King of Prussia wrote a Letter to the said States. The Collection that was made for the poor Vaudois, amounted in Amsterdam to 125000 Guilders, and at Rotterdam to 45000; the Jews, from Motives of Humanity, or of Policy, contributing largely thereto. Count Golofkin, who is to come hither from Paris, in Quality of Ambassadour from the Czarina to the States General, having sent hither to desire Passports for his Baggage, they have been dispatched to him.

Hague, Sept. 18, N.-S. The Duke of Lorraine was expected here as on To-morrow and therefore Lodgings were provided for his Reception; but we learn to Day by Letters from Antwerp, that he finds so much Entertainment in that City, that he will not leave it till next Week. The Differences which had long subsisted between the States General and the Court of Denmark, on account of the Arrears due to the Danish Troops which served in the last War, are now finally adjusted; a Convention signed at Copenhagen by the Danish Commissaries and the Dutch Resident, having been transmitted hither some Days ago.
