THE Elector of Mentz is expected here To-morrow. All the Emperour's Privy - Councillours and Lords of his Bedchamber are ordered to assist at his Electoral Highness's Entry into this City. The Cardinal Archbishop, the Pope's Nuncio, the Ambassadour of Venice, and several other Foreign Ministers, will meet his Electoral Highness at some Distance from this City, and come in with him. Yesterday two large Vessels went down the River for Hungary, having on board several Officers of the Regiment of Cuirassiers commanded by the Prince of Darmstadt, and a Number of Recruits for the Regiment of Dragoons of Wirtemberg. The Regiments of Dragoons of Jorger and Althan are ordered to march to the Frontiers of Saltzbourg, with three Troops of Dragoons of the Regiment of Prince Ferdinand of Bavaria, three of Prince Eugene's, three of Watterborn's, and a Battallion of the Regiment of Wurmbrandt. An Imperial Mandate has been issued bearing Date the 26th of last Month, in which the Emperour exhorts and commands the Inhabitants of the Archbishoprick of Saltzbourg, who, complaining of Hardships imposed upon them with respect to Religion, and of other Grievances, have revolted against the Archbishop their Sovereign, to forbear all Acts of Force and Violence, and to apply themselves to his Imperial Majesty as supreme Judge of the Empire, and represent their Grievances to him, promising

them all just Satisfaction, conformable to the Constitutions of the Empire.

Berlin, Sept. 8. The King sets out To-morrow for Wusterhausen. The Queen and the Royal Family will go thither next Tuesday; and the Court will continue there till St. Hubert's Day. The Saddle-Horses and Equipage which the King has given to the Prince Royal, are sent to Custrin, where his Royal Highness continues to reside, and often takes the Diversion of Hunting in the Neighbourhood of that Place. The Hereditary Prince of Bareith is gone to Passelwack, with Lieutenant-Colonel Shenck, in order to see the Regiment of Gardarmes pass in Review. Baron Danckelman, Son in Law of Lieutenant-General Borck, is to go to Ratisbon, with the Character of his Prussian Majesty's Minister to the Dyet.

From on board the Namur under Sail out of Cadix Bay, August 16, O. S. Sir Charles Wager, with the Squadron of His Majesty's Ships under his Command, is now under Sail for Gibraltar, where the two Regiments and Wine for the Squadron are to be taken in, which it is supposed will be done in three or four Days, and then Sir Charles Wager will sail for Barcelona, where he will remain till the Spanish Ships of War joyn him, and then proceed with them to Italy. The Marquis de Mari is to command the Spanish Squadron; their Ships in this Bay will be ready in a Week, and those from Corunna are expected within that Time at farthest. The Hector join'd us from Gibraltar the 14th Instant.
