Moscow, August 16, O. S.

MAdemoiselle Oginska, Daughter of the Palatine of Wilna, who had been invited hither by the Czarina, set out the 11th Instant to return to Poland : Great Civilities have been shewn that Lady from this Court during her Stay here, and her Majesty and Princess Elizabeth made her very considerable Presents at her Departure. Yesterday two Battallions of the Preobrazenky Guards set out for Petersbourg.

Berlin, Sept. 18, N. S. On Saturday last the Hereditary Prince of Bareith came to Town from his Quarters at Passewalck, and the next Day his Highness went to Wusterhausen, where he will spend some Time in Hunting with the King. Lieutenant-General Levenvolde, the Czarina's Minister to the Emperour, is expected here in a few Days in his Way to Vienna.

Copenhagen, Sept. 18, N. S. The King of Denmark, who comes now and then to Town for a Day or two, generally at those Times makes a Visit to his Fleet, and leaves some Mark of the Satisfaction

and Pleasure he takes in it. The great Work of pulling down the Palace and rebuilding it, seems to have been undertaken upon his Majesty's own Resolution. M. Haxthausen, one of the Gentlemen of his Danish Majesty's Bedchamber, set out the Day before Yesterday for Cassel, being sent with his Master's Compliments to the King of Sweden upon his Majesty's Arrival in his German Dominions.

Hague, Sept. 25, N. S. The Duke of Lorrain, who goes by the Name of Count de Blamont, arrived here the 23d Instant at Night. He came from Antwerp by Water to Rotterdam, in one of the four Yachts which had been sent from Rotterdam to receive him and his Retinue. It is said he designs to go over to England, and that he will probably take his Passage in the Yacht which is expected to bring over General Diemar. This Day he was entertained at Dinner, with all his Retinue, and a good Number of Persons of Quality, by the Earl of Chesterfield. Yesterday came Advice from Friesland of the Death of M. de Gossinga, a Gentleman eminent for his Abilities and Probity and Services to this State.

Hague, Sept. 28, N. S. The Admiralties of the several Colleges continue here, and the Extraordinary Deputation from Zealand being arrived, they have all had Conferences together with the Deputies of the States General, concerning the new Tariff or Customs to be paid for Goods imported or exported. The Duke of Lorrain is entertained daily with Feasts and Balls: Yesterday he was treated by Count Zinzendorf, and will be again To-morrow by the Earl of Chesterfield. The Duke proposes to set out from hence next Monday to see the rest of the Towns of the Province of Holland: After which it is believed he will embark for England.

Letters from Seville of the 15th Instant, N. S. come in this Morning, give an Account, that the Marquess de Mari, Admiral of the King of Spain's Fleet that is to attend the Introduction of the Spanish Garrisons into Tuscany, failed from Cadiz the 12th, with the Spanish Men of War which were in that Bay, for the general Rendezvous at Barcelona.
