Copenhagen, September 25, N. S.

COUNT Dehn is entred into the Service of this Crown, and has the Title of Privy Councillor: He set out last Week for Brunswick to settle his private Affairs, where he says he is to wait for the King of Denmark's Orders for his Employment; but it is generally believed, that he has already received Instructions to reside at Ratisbon on the Part of the Danish Court. M. Haxthausen is not charged with any Business at Cassel, but is only to compliment the King of Sweden, and invite his Majesty to pass hither on his Return to Stockholm.

Hague, Oct. 2, N. S. The Duke of Lorrain proposes to set out from hence the 4th Instant for Leyden, thence to proceed to Amsterdam. General Diemar arrived here Yesterday, and this Morning proceedeth on his Journey for Cassel by the Way of Amsterdam. Count Golofkin being arrived here, presented his Credentials this Morning to the President of the States, as Ambassador in Ordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Czarina.

From on board the Namur at Barcelona, Sept. 4. In our Passage from Gibraltar for this Port, we stopt three Days in Altea Bay, and took in what fresh Water we wanted. We sailed from thence the 30th past, and arrived here Yesterday, having been

two Days becalmed. We find the Troops here ready to embark for Italy, so only wait for the Ships from Cadiz. His Majesty's Squadron is in a good Condition. The Hector is with the Agent Victualler, buying Wine and Oyl for the Squadron. We expect the Biddeford every Day clean from Port-Mahon. From Altea Bay Sir Charles Wager sent the Kinfales to Leghorn. The Conde de Clavijo is coming in here with his Squadron of five Sail.
