*Moscow, August 30, O. S.*

ON the 27th Instant died in a Monastery near this City, Ewdokia Foedorowna Lapuckin, first Wife to Peter the Great, who was separated from his Czarish Majesty, and confined in a Prison for several Years: During which Imprisonment she lost her only Son the Czarowitz. When her Grandson Peter the Second ascended the Throne, she was taken out of Prison, and had no sooner got a little over her past Misfortunes, but had the Grief to see her Grand-Daughter the Princess Natalia depart this Life, who was soon followed by her Grandson Peter the Second.

*Brussels, Oct. 3, N. S.* The first Instant being the Anniversary of his Imperial Majesty's Birth-day, the same was celebrated at the Archdutchess's Court with great Splendour and Magnificence. It was declared that Day, that his Imperial Majesty had named the Count de Salm for the Bishoprick of Tournay. The Count de Flemming, Captain in the King of Prussia's Service, is come hither, to ask Leave of the Go-

vernment to raise some Recruits in this Country for the Regiment of his Prussian Majesty's Great Grenadiers, and it is believed it will be granted him.

*Hague, Oct. 5, N. S.* Count Golofkin, Ambassadour from the Czarina, having delivered his Credential Letters to the President of the Assembly of the States General, he has been acknowledged in that Quality by their High Mightinesses, and on the 2d Instant was complimented by the President on that Occasion. The same Day Admiral Perez, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperour of Morocco, had a Conference with the Deputies of the States. On the 1st Instant his Excellency the Count de Sinzendorff gave a magnificent Entertainment to the Duke of Lorrain, and to a great Number of Persons of Distinction, on account of the Anniversary of his Imperial Majesty's Birth-day. On the 2d that Duke dined with the Marquess de Fenelon, Ambassadour from the French King. Yesterday about Noon the Duke of Lorrain went from hence, to dine at a Country House which Count Sinzendorff has hired in the Neighbourhood of Leiden, and to lodge that Night at Leiden, where he proposes to stay

two Days, and then to proceed to Amsterdam. The extraordinary Deputies from Zealand and the Commissioners of the Chambers of Admiralty, are gone Home with what has been projected here as to the making of Alterations in the new Tarif: And they are shortly to return hither, to come to a final Determination of that Affair. The General of Batavia, and some other chief Officers in the East-Indies, being charged with Misdemeanours, are sent for Home by the States General to answer for themselves.

*Hampton-Court, September 25.*

This Evening Mr. Turner, one of His Majesty's Messengers arrived here from Vienna, and brought the Emperour's and the King of Spain's respective Ratifications of the Treaty signed there the 22d of July last, which had been exchanged with those of His Majesty; and likewise an Instrument for the Accession and Admission of the Great Duke of Tuscany to the abovesaid Treaty, which was signed at Vienna the 21st Instant, N. S. by the Ministers Plenipotentiary of the Emperour, the King, the King of Spain, and the said Great Duke respectively.
