P Reparations for the Reception of the Czarina are making here, tho' it is not known that her Majesty has yet fixed a Time for her Departure from Moscow, and tho' 'tis even doubted she will not make the Journey hither this Year. We have Advice from Moscow, that our Court have sent an Officer to Spahan, with new Instructions for Baron Schafiroff, the Russian Envoy Extraordinary there.

Vienna, Sept. 26, N. S. Their Imperial Majesties are with the Elector of Mentz at Halbthurn, whence they design to come with him to the Favorita by the 3d of next Month, which being his Electoral Highness's Name-day, Fireworks are preparing in the Gardens there to be played off on that Occasion. His Electoral Highness has fixed the 6th of next Month for his Departure from hence. The Marquis de Maluspina, Lieutenant-General in his Imperial Majesty's Service, is made Governour of Pavia in the Milaneze, in the Room of General Sarmanni, deceased: And the Government of Tortona, vacant by the

Death of General Janus, is conferred on Lieutenant-Colonel Stensch, Lieutenant of the Regiment of Foot of Palsi. Baron Franken, Minister of the Elector Palatine, is arrived here. M. Braun, Agent from the Count Palatine de Berkenfeld, has received by a Courier Advice of the Death of the Duke of Deux-ponts, which he has notified by a Memorial presented to the Aulick Council. A Vessel is fitting up with good Accommodations for carrying the Turkish Ambassadour down the Danube from hence to Belgrade, and other Vessels are appointed for carrying his Domesticks and Baggage.

Hague, Oct. 9, N. S. The Duke of Lorraine is at Amsterdam, viewing what is most remarkable in that City; and Admiral Sommelodyk being there, shews him all that relates to the Naval Service. The Great Pensionary being well enough to go Abroad, will assist in the Assembly of the States of this Province of Holland, which is to be held Tomorrow. The Fubs Yacht, which brought over General Diemat, has Orders to stay till the Duke of Lorraine is ready to embark for England.
