H E British Squadron, commanded by Sir Charles Wager, which failed from hence the oth Instant, hawing ever fince had fair Weather and a favourable Wind, there is reason to hope they have already passed the Gulph of Lyons.

The Introduction of the Spanish Garrisons being now finish'd, the Grand Duke has returned his Thanks to the British Admiral, and Mr. Colman his Britannick Majesty's Minister, for the Part they have acted upon this Occasion; with which Count Charni, General of the King of Spain's Forces here, and the Marquess de Mari the Spanish Admiral, are equally pleased. Mr. Colman is set out for Florence; the Spanish Minister returned thither some Days before; and the Marquess Rinuccini, the G and Duke's Minister, is likewise going back to Florence.
