THE three Provinces of Guelderland, Friseland, and Groninguen, of which the Prince of Nassau Frise is Stadtholder, have proposed to the States General, that his Highness should be immediately admitted into the Council of State. The Deputies of those three Provinces have likewise been with the Pensionary, to ask in particular the Consent of the Province of Holland to this Admission. The said States of Holland separated on Saturday last, and are to reassemble next Week. The Commissioners of their Admiralties are likewise gone Home; and it is said they are to send Orders to Captain Schryver, who commands the three Men of War which have been at Algiers, and are now at Cadiz, to continue about the Streights till he receives further Orders.
