Dutchess of Mecklenbourg's Birth-day, all the Foreign Ministers and Nobility went in the Morning to make her their Compliments, and supped at Court; but there was no Ball, because her Sister the Princess Proscovia was not yet buried. That Funeral Solemnity was performed this Day with

great Pomp.

Stockholm, Nov. 17, O. S. His Swedish Majesty, with Prince Maximilian of Hesse, arrived the 12th Instant at Carlberg, about Two in the Asternoon. The Queen, by a violent Cold being prevented meeting the King there, Count Horn went with her Majesty's Compliments, which the King returned in Person, the' incognito, and staid that Night in Town: The next Morning early his Majesty went back to Carlberg, where he receiv'd the Compliments of the Senate, Colleges, and Nobility, and preceded by them all in their Ranks, made his publick Entry here from thence, attended by a Number of the Burghers form'd into Troops of Horse, the Streets being lined all along by the Militia and Guards. A Temple of Fame was erected in the Court of the Palace, under which the

Queen, attended by all the Ladies of the Court, receiv'd his Majesty. A Con-HE 29th of October being the fort of Musick was personn'd whilst the Troops were marching to the different Market Places, where they made feveral Volleys of Small Arms, and the Artillery from the feveral Batteries" made 1600 Discharges. Afternoon the Foreign Ministers were admitted to make their Compliments to their Swedish Majesties, and the hext, Day to Prince Maximilian. The fame Evening the whole Town was illuminated. On Monday there was a Ball at Court, which began at Eight, and lasted till Two in the Morning, at which both their Majestics, and the Prince danced.
