A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS Hugh Earl of Loudoun was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to fit in the House of Peers of the present Parliament of Great Britain, and is since deceased; in order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his Room, We do, by the Advice of our Privy Council, issue forth this our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holy-Rood House in Edinburgh, on Friday the Twenty Eighth Day of January next ensuing, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and chuse another Peer of Scotland, to sit and vote in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of Great Britain, in the Room of the faid Hugh Earl of Loudoun deceafed, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies for such as shall be absent, such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing, duly figned before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law. And the Lord Clerks Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and immediately after such Election made and duly examined, to certify the Name of the Peer fo elected, and fign and attest the same in Presence of the said Peers, and Return fuch Certificate into our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And we strictly charge and command that this our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Twenty Five Days at the least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to fuch Election.
