The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

T the Court at St. James's, the Fourth

This Day the Right Honourable Pattee Byng, Efq; was by His Majefty's Command fworn of His Majefty's moft Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

17/ Hereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Letters Patent bearing Date the Fourth Day of July 1730, to grant unto Robert Hamblin for the Term of Fourteen Years, the fole Use and Benefit of a new Invention for diftinguithing of Lights, whereby one Light erected for the Guidance of Shipping, might be perfectly known from another ; in which Letters Patent it was provided, that in cafe the faid Hamblin did not particularly deferibe and ascertain the Nature of the faid Invention, by Writing under his Hand and Seal, to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery within one Calendar Month from the Date of the faid Letters Patent, then the faid Letters Patent should forthwith cease and be utterly void. And it was also further provided, that if at any Time during the faid Fourteen Years it fhould be made appear to His Majefty, or any Six or more of His Privy Council, that the faid Grant was contrary to Law, or prejudicial or inconvenient to the Subjects in general, or that the faid Invention was not a new Invention as to the publick Use and Exercise thereof, or not invented or found out by the faid Robert Hamblin, then, upon Signification or Declaration thereof to be made by His Majefty, or by the Lords or others of His Privy Council, or any Six or more of them, under their Hands, the faid Letters Patent thould ceafe, and be null and void.

And whereas the Mafter, Wardens, and Affiftants of the Corporation of Trinity Houfe of Deptford Strond, in the County of Kent, have by their Petition lately prefented to His Majefty in Council, humbly prayed, that the Letters Patent fo granted to the faid Robert Hamblin might be vacated, in regard the faid Hamblin hath not purfued the Defign for which the faid Letters Patent were granted to him, but under Colour thereof, hath erefted a Swimming Light at the Nore, and propofes to erect others at different Places upon the Sea Coaft, as likewife to publifh a new Chart of all the Sea Coafts of England; That he hath not enrolled in the High Court of Chancery fuch a Defeription of the faid Invention as is required by the faid Letters Patent; that this Project is not a new Invention, and that the Ufe he is making of it may be highly prejudicial to the Publick.

And whereas the Lords of the Committee of His Majeity's most Honourable Privy Council, (to whom His Majesty referred the Consideration of the faid Petition and Patent) have

this Day reported to His Majesty in Council, that they had referred the fame to His Majesty's Attorney and Sollicitor General, who having heard Counsel for the Petitioners, as also for the faid Robert Hamblin, reported to the faid Committee, that they were of Opinion, that the Invention pretended to by the faid Robert Hamblin, is not new, and that he hath not performed the Condition in the Letters Patent, whereby he is required to enroll a Specification thereof; the Influ= ment enrolled by him, not afcertaining the Nature of the Invention, or the Method by which it is to be carried into Execution: That it appeared to them from the Inftrument enrolled, and from the Swimming Light already erected, that the faid Robert Hamblin hath aimed at obtaining a Power of fetting up new Lights under Colour of the faid Letters Patent, rather than of diffin-guishing those now in being; but as no such Power is granted him by the faid Letters  $Pa^{2\nu}$ tent, they were of Opinion, that fuch Attempt is not warranted thereby, and is therefore an Abuse of the Grant, and contrary to Law; and that it further appeared to them, that his general Project of erecting new Lights, particularly Swimming Lights, whereever he thinks fit upon the Coafts of England; and of making a new Chart of fuch Coafts, may be highly prejudicial and inconveniet. to His Majefty's Subjects, and injurious to the Trade and Navigation of this Kingdom : For which Reafons they were of Opinion, that the faid Letters Patent ought to be determined and made void according to the Power therein referved. And the Lords of the Committee of Gouncil agreeing in Opinion with his Majefty's Attorney and Solli-citor General that the faid Letters Patent ought to be vacated,

His Majefty in Council this Day took the fame into His Royal Confideration, and was pleafed to Order, that for the Reafons abovementioned, the faid Letters Patent granted to Robert Hamblin, fhould be made void. In purfuance whereof, and of the Power referved in the faid Letters Patent, We do, for the Reafons abovementioned, hereby fignify and declare the Letters Patent granted to Robert Hamblin for diffinguifhing of Lights, to be void. And the faid Letters Patent are from henceforth to ceafe, determine, and be utterly void to all Intents and Purpofes : Whereof all Perfons whom it may concern are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
