Trinity-House, London, June 22, 1732.

Whereas by an Act of the late Sessions of Parliament it is (int' al^y) Enacted, That if any Person shall, after the 24th of June, 1732, take upon himself the Charge of any Ship or Vessel as Pilot down the River Thames, or through the North Channel to or by Orfordness, or round the Long-sandhead into the Downs, or down the South Channel into the Downs, or from or by Orfordness up the North Channel, or the River of Thames, or the River Medway, other than such Person as shall be licensed to act as a Pilot by the Master, Wardens and Assistants of the Corporation of Trinity-House, under their common Seal, every Person so offending, and being thereof lawfully convicted in Manner therein mentioned, shall for every such Offence forfeit the Sum of Twenty Pounds; but the said Act provides, That nothing herein contained shall extend to the obliging of any Master Owner of any Ship in the Coal Trade, or other coasting Trade, to employ or make use of any Pilot.

And by the said Act it is further Enacted, That no Master or Commander of any Ship outward-bound, shall receive, or cause or permit to be received on board any such Ship, any Gunpowder, either as Merchandize, or as Store or Ammunition for the Voyage, (except for His Majesty's Service) before such Ship shall be at, over-against, or below Blackwall, upon Pain of forfeiting, for every Fifty Pounds Weight of such Gunpowder.

And by the said Act it is further Enacted, That the Master or Commander of every Ship coming into the River of Thames, shall land and put on Shore all the Powder on board such Ship, either before the Arrival of such Ship at Blackwall, or within Twenty Four Hours, in case the Weather shall permit, after such Ship shall come to an Anchor there, or at the Place of her unloading, upon Pain of forfeiting the Sum of Five Pounds for every Fifty Pounds Weight of Gunpowder found on board, and in the like Proportion for a greater or less Quantity; And if any Gunpowder shall be found on board any such Ship above Blackwall after the Time thereby limited for unloading the same, the Master or Commander of every such Ship shall, for every Fifty Pounds Weight of Gunpowder so found on board, forfeit the Sum of Five Pounds, and so in Proportion for a greater or lesser Quantity.

And by the said Act it is further Enacted, That if any Master or Commander, or other Officer of any Ship (except His Majesty's Ships) shall, while such Ship shall lye or be in the River Thames between London-Bridge and Blackwall, keep any Gun or Guns of and belonging to such Ship, shotted or loaded with Ball, or shall fire or discharge, or cause or permit to be fired or discharged, any Gun or Guns on board such Ship lying above Blackwall, before Sun-rising, or after Sun-setting, such Master, Commander or Officer, shall, for every such Gun so kept shotted or loaded, forfeit the Sum of Five Shillings; and for every Gun so fired or discharged, the Sum of Ten Shillings: And also, that if any Master or Commander, or other Officer of any Ship, or any other Person on board the same, shall, while such Ship shall lye or be in the River of Thames between London-Bridge and Blackwall, heat or melt, or cause or permit to be heated or melted by Fire, Loggerheat Shot, or any other Thing on board any such Ship, any Pitch, Tarr, Rosin, Grease, Tallow, Oil, or other such combustible Matter or Things, every Person or Persons so offending shall forfeit the Sum of Five Pounds; all which Penalties are payable to the Use of the Poor of the said Corporation. *The Master, Wardens, and Assistants of the said Corporation have caused this publick Notice to be given, that no Person may pretend to be ignorant of the aforesaid Law.*
