S. and T.O. was likewife fent to Mr. Fairchild, of Great Queen-fireet, by the Penny Post, requiring him to leave Twenty Guineas in the Place above-mentioned, and threatning, in case of Refusal, to set his House on Fire. And whereas another Letter, dated the 11th of July, 1732, and figned T. M. was delivered to the faid Mr. Fairchild's Servant by a Boy unknown, containing the Jame threatning Expressions, and repeating the fame Demand : Her Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in so beinous a Grime, is pleased to promise His Majesty's most gracious Pardon to any one or two of them, who shall difcover his or their Accon lice or A. complices, fo as be er they may be apprehended and convitted thereof.
