Gohrde, Sept. 1, N. S. On Saturday the 30th of last Month the King left Zell about Nine in the Morning, and arrived here the same Day between One and Two in the Afternoon. This Day his Majesty and the whole Court took the Diversion of Stag-hunting. The 4th and 5th his Majesty intends to entertain himself in reviewing the Troops cantoned in this Neighbourhood, and on Saturday the 6th to set out from this Place for Hanover.

Hague, Sept. 3, N. S. The Troops appointed to form the Camp at Oosterhout, are all on the March thither. That Camp will be formed on the 5th. The General Officers are gone from hence to give the necessary Orders. The Prince of Nassau-Orange set out from hence Yesterday to repair thither, and on Saturday last arrived here the Prince of Beveren, who will shortly be going thither. It is rumoured that the King of Prussia will come to see the Camp: And from France the Count de Clermont, the Duke d'Uzez, and the Chevalier d'Orleans, are expected there.
