Venice, Sept. 7. We are now certainly told that the Captain Baba having long in vain expected the Galleys of Argiers, Tunis and Tripoli, to come and joyn with him, in order to their making head againit the Malteles and other Christian Galleys, who have not onely of late very much infelted the Turkish Navigation, having taken several of their thips very richly laden and bound to Constantinople, but been likewise aihoar on some of the Islandsam the Archipelago, and done much milchiet there, is retired home with his Fleet, with intentions as is faid to reinforce the fame, and then to come out to Sea again. General Morofini with fome other perfons of quality concerned in the bufinels, relating to the publick expences at Cantia, during the late War, have obtained some inlargement out of Pri to 1, being at prefent onely confined to their feveral Apartmenes in the Palace of St. Marc, and it is faid, that this matter may be now very fuddainly determined by the Commissioners, in whole hands the examination of this affair is. From Dalmatia they tell usy that all things are very still and quier in those parts, the Subjects of this State holding a very good correspondence with those of the Port, and moture offices of Friendthip and good Neighberhood paffing daily between them ; However Signier Morofin's Proveditor General of that Country, having defired to quit that Government, the Senate bave granified him herein, and accordingly have appointed huSucceffor, who is now preparing for his journey thither. From the Port we can onely hear, that the Optomian Borces are now very near Poland, but that it is thought, after all, the Grand Signior will readily accept of the Proposals which may be made on the part of that Crown for Peace, to which he feems to be much inclined.

Rome, S pt 10. We cannot yet hear of any effect the Popes Mediation hash had for composing matters between the Duke of Savoy and State of Genoua, howeverb Curdmal Raggi, continues his endeavors for the difpoling the latter thereunto, as Signior Spata the Popes Nuncio is not wanting to do at the Court of Saving ; and we still hope shortly to have an account of the good furcels of their Negotiation. The intended promotion of Cardinals, is at prefent the subject of much discourse here at Court, all perions being very follicitous to know, who are defignred for this advancement.; Don Felice Rospigliosi, is certainly faid shall be one, as for the others, it is as yet vory doubtfully ipoken. We have been often told, that the Marquis de Liche was very fuddainly expected fiele ; in quality of Extraordinary Ambaffador from the Crown of Spain, but hearing not as yet that heds on his journey hither, or in any readinels taundartake it, it is thought, he will not be to fnorthereas was reported.

Offerd Sept. 28. Here are arrived leveral Vefiels from the coalt of Holland, which tell us of the Durch Fleets being gone in, each Squadron to its respective Province; and by Paffengers come yesterday firm Zoaland we are told, that 19 of their Men of War were arrived at the Flack-e before Hliffing, baing very much torn and fhattened by the bad weather ; molt of the Men of War having lott all their Cables and Anchors, and been hefides in fo great want of Provisions, that the Seamen were, it is faid, fome days without any allowance. We have news here of the Scotch Capers having taken 12 Dutch Euft Counsers Ships with their Convey, all laden with Corn ; that two of the faid Eleet had been call away orbithe coaft of Helland, and the relt got into the Eems.

Hague, Sept. 23 To morrow his Highnels the, Prince of Orange is expected here in Town again, in order to the concluding feveral matters which were left unfinished at his Highnesses last going hence to the Army, The Baron vin Ghent. late Envoye on the part of this State, in France, being returned hither, was yesterday in the Allembly of the States-General, to give them an actount of his Negotiation at that Court, during the short stay he made there. The Heer van Bergen, President of the Schepen at Breday is lately made Mafter of Requests to his Highnefs. The Deputies of Licge continue still here, not having as yet been able to obtain any fatisfactory answer to their proposals for a moderation of the Contribution, exacted from the Countrey of Liege, by the Governor of Maestricht.

From Halberstadt we have no freiher advice, but that which told us, that the Elector of Brandenburgh intended to break up from thence the 14 infant, and to march towards the Wefer, to joyn with the Imperial. Troops, who according to our last news, were arrived at Mulhausen, nine Leagues from the Wefer. Of the motions of the French Army, we hear not any thing fince our laft, who were then marching towards Lipstadt.

Whitehal, Sept. 19. This Evening his Royal Highnels arrived at Court from the Fleet, to the great joy of their Majesties and the whole Kingdom, in perfect health (thanks be to God ) after the many and great dangers to which his Highnesses Perfon had been exposed during this Summers War, equally with the meaneft Seaman.

Tarmouth, Sept. 20. This day the Argiers Frigat meeting off of Alborough with a Dutch Caper of about fix Guns, the Captam immediately cauled his Guns, as likewife his Colours to be all taken in,. upon which the Caper supposing here Collier-came boldly up, and not discovering the mistake, till it was too late, the Frigar after having faluted her with several Guns took her, and hath this Evening brought her in here.
