ADVICES from Berlin agree with those received from Wefel, that his Prussian Majesty had ordered the Dutch Officers he had caused to be arrested, to be set at Liberty, but not the common Soldiers. The Prince of Orange has put off his Departure for Friesland till the 12th Instant, when the States of Holland are to meet. On Saturday last Mr. Finch, His Britannick Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary, arrived here, and delivered Yesterday Morning his Credentials to the States.
