THE Prince of Bevern arrived here the 3d Instant, and had the Honour to dine the same Day with her Czarish Majesty, by whom he was graciously received.

Hague, March 10, N. S. The last Letters from Berlin bring Advice, that the King of Prussia had demanded of the Dutch Merchants at Konigsberg, who do not consist of more than five or six Families, and who are but Factors for the Merchants of Amsterdam, 25000 Rixdollars, as a Tax for the Relief of the Saltburgers lately settled in his Prussian Majesty's Territories. The Assembly of the States of Holland remains fixed for Thursday next, when it is thought the Resolution concerning the Delivery of the late King William's Effects demanded by the Prince of Orange, with the Additions and Corrections proposed on the Part of his Highness, will be consented to. In the mean while his Highness continues here, waiting the Issue of that Affair.
