General Count Levenvolde is to fet out this Evening or to Morrow Morning to go to Warfaw as her Czarish Majefty's Ambaffadour Extraordinary and Minifter Plenipotentiary. His Excellency's Retinue will be fo numerous, that it is believed his Embaffy will be one of the moft magnificent that has been feen in Europe for a long while. He will have above 20 Officers and Gentlemen, five of the Czarina's Coaches and five Setts of very fine Horfes, 12 of her Majefty's Footmen, and fix Pages with her Majefty's Liveries, beſides a vaſt Number of his own Servants. He is to be guarded by 50 of her Majeſty's Horſe-Guards, and 18 Grenadiers of his own Regiment of Foot Guards. M. Lipsky is expected here from Poland, to notify the Death of the late King to this Court; as is alſo Count Lynard from the Elector of Saxony.
