**B**ARON Sparre, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sweden to the Court of Great-Britain, passed through this City last Wednesday from Stockholm on his Return to England. M. Mauritius, Resident from the States General to the Hanse Towns, has received Credentials, appointing him their Minister to the several Princes and States of the Circles of Lower Saxony and Westphalia.

*Hague, April 21, N. S.* The Meeting of the States of the Province of Holland remains fixed to the 29th Instant. Brigadier Wassenaer, is become one of the Competitors for the Command of the Regiment of Foot Guards. We hear nothing further of the Dutch Soldiers, whom it was said the King of Prussia had ordered to be discharged from their Confinement; nor is the Accommodation between this State and that King in any Forwardness. The Prince of Orange is expected back here from Leeuwarden the End of this Week. The Prince of Nassau Ziegen, of the Protestant Line, is also expected here daily, to solicit the Claim which his Brother, who is in Spain, puts in to Part of the Effects left by the late King William.
