Stockholm, April 4.

M. Einshidel, Minister from the Elector of Saxony, arrived here the 31st of last Month. He had his Audience of their Swedish Majesties Yesterday, when he notified them the late King of Poland's Death, for which this Court will go into Mourning on Sunday next. M. Utterodt had also an Audience the same Day, and presented his new Letters of Credence from the Elector of Saxony. A Turkish Envoy arrived the 2d Instant, and at his coming to the Bridge was saluted with 16 Guns, and received by the Master of the Ceremonies and the Chamberlain Duben, who conducted him and his Officers in the King of Sweden's Coaches to his Lodgings. Baron Craffau set out this Morning on his Return to his Post at the Court of Vienna.

Hague, April 24, N. S. The Dutch Merchants at Konigsberg and their Correspondents at Amsterdam, have been told by Order of the King of Prussia, that they may continue their Trade without any Fear of Molestation. The Dutch Soldiers who were made Prisoners have at last been released, and have joined their Regiments. The Prisons were opened, but not the least Assistance given to them, so that they were obli-

ged to beg all the Way; and the King of Prussia has declared he has granted their Liberty wholly out of Regard to the Emperor's Intercession. The States of Holland are expected here on Tuesday next, in order to assemble the next Day. The Prince of Orange, it is said, designs to be here against that Time, in order to pursue his Demand of the Delivery of the late King William's Effects belonging to him. As to Ter Veer and Flushing, the Provinces of Holland and Zeeland, according to their late Agreement, have ordered their Courts of Justice not to meddle in any thing relating to that Marquisate. The States have received a Letter from M. Rumpff, their Minister in Poland, giving an Account that M. Levenvolde had declared there, that his Brother was coming to Warfaw with an Attendance of 280 Persons, 50 of them being the Czarina's Life Guards, and most of the rest Officers. M. Van Hoey, the Dutch Ambassadour at the French Court, has obtained Leave to come hither upon his private Affairs.
