Copenhagen, April 28, N. S. The King of Denmark's Journey to Norway seems now to be fixed, the 12th of next Month being appointed for his Majesty's Departure for Jutland. The Convoy which is to sail this Week meets him at Flastrand, from whence the Passage into Norway is but short. M. Berkenstin set out the 22d Instant on his Return to Vienna.
