*Petersbourg, June 16, O. S.*

**I**T is reported that Felt-Marshal Trubetzkoj and General Soltikoff are soon expected here from Moscow, as is also General Wifeback from the Ukraine, to be present at a Grand Council of War. The Dutchess of Mecklenbourg, who had been a long while in a declining Condition, departed this Life the 14th Instant, about Eight of the Clock in the Evening. Her Czarish Majesty is very much afflicted, and is to set out very soon for Peterhoff, that she may not be in Town at the Time of her Sister's Obsequies. Count Lynard and M. le Fort, the Saxon Ministers, having received new Credentials from their Master, in which the Elector has given the Title of Empress to her Czarish Majesty, they had the Honour to present the same to the Czarina on the 9th Instant.

*Hague, July 17, N. S.* The Regents of this State are very much taken up with the Affairs of Poland, it being apprehended that the Election of a new King there may be attended with such Circumstances as may draw on a War, which it is to be wished might be prevented. The States have lately written to the Emperour, as well to exhort him to use pacifick Measures upon this Occasion, as to furnish the Garrisons of the Low-Countries with necessary Stores for their Defence, with which they are at present but ill provided. The States of Holland will separate To-morrow, and probably, as they have been taken up with other Business, they will defer the Affair of the Delivery of the Effects demanded by the Prince of Orange, till another Meeting. A Place in the Council of State is become vacant by the Death of the Baron de Langerac, one of the Deputies on the Part of the Nobles, who died at Boisleduc, whether he was gone on a Commission with some other Deputies. It is thought that Brigadier General Waffenaer will offer to resign his

Military Employments for this. It is likewise thought that M. Bentink, eldest Son of the Lady Portland, will be a Competitor for the said Employment of Counsellour of State.
