**A** Most dutiful and loyal Address of the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly of the Province of Maryland in America, has been presented to His Majesty by the Right Honourable the Lord Baltimore, Proprietor of the said Province : Which His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

*Hampton-Court, Aug. 18.* His Majesty has been pleased to grant unto Major General Richard Sutton, the Office of Governour of the Island of Guernsey, and the Islands and Territories thereunto belonging, the Island of Alderney only excepted, in the Room of George Earl of Cholmondeley, deceased.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint Lieutenant General William Evans, to be Colonel of the Queen's own Royal Regiment of Horse, in the Room of his Grace the Duke of Argyll and Greenwich.
