*Warsaw, August 29, N. S.*

**T**HE Day before Yesterday Prince Wiefnowieski, Regimentary of Lithuania, was accosted by a Lieutenant of the Polish Army; who came briskly up to him while in the Field of Election, and said, that he was surprized to hear that the Muscovite Troops were in Lithuania, without his having opposed their Entering: The Prince asked him how it was possible? The Lieutenant answered, If he did not know, he should give up the Command to one that did; whereupon the Prince fell into a Passion, and a Follower of his struck the Lieutenant, which occasioned a great Disturbance. Yesterday Morning the said Prince passed the River Vistula, which runs by the Town, and went where the Lithuanians are encamped, accompanied by the Prince Sangusko Marshal of Lithuania, the Prince Radzivil Master of the Horse, and several of their Friends. The Primate and Senate sent a Deputation to them to come back, but to no Purpose.

*Copenhagen, Sept. 1, N. S.* The last Letters from the Danish Court were dated Au-

gust the 25th at Larwigen in Norway, from whence they may come to Elfenore with a fair Wind in less than 48 Hours; and as the Wind has now continued for some time to blow very fair, their Majesties are expected there every Moment.

*Hambourg, Sept. 4, N. S.* Baron Starck, whom the Duke of Holstein has appointed to go to the Court of Great Britain with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary, arrived here some Days ago, and intends to set out from hence at the latter End of next Week for the Hague, where he is to execute a Commission, and from thence to proceed for England.

*Hague, Sept. 15, N. S.* The Prince of Orange came Abroad on Sunday last, and is in perfect good Health.

*Hague, Sept. 18, N. S.* The States of Holland have been since their Meeting wholly taken up with disposing of the Military vacant Employments. They are the next Week to deliberate upon the Memorial of the Marquess de Fenelon, which relates to the Neutrality for the Low Countries. Advices from Berlin confirm the Election of a Marshal of the Diet of Poland.
