HE Day before Yesterday Prince Wiesnowieski, Regimentary of Lithuania, was accosted by a Lieute-nant of the Polish Army; who came briskly up to him while in the Field of Election, and faid, that he was furprized to hear that the Muscovite Troops were in Lithuania, without his having opposed their Entring : The Prince asked him how it was polible ? The Lieutenant answered, If he did not know, he fhould give up the Command to one that did; whereupon the Prince fell into a Paffion, and a Follower of his ftruck the Lieutenant, which occasioned a great Difturbance. Yesterday Morning the faid Prince paffed the River Viftula, which runs by the Town, and went where the Li-thuanians are encamped, accompanied by the Prince Sangusko Marshal of Lithuania, the Prince Radzivil Master of the Horse, and several of their Friends. 'The Primate and Senate fent a Deputation to them to come back, but to no Purpole.

Copenhagen, Sept. 1, N. S. The last Let-Ters from the Danish Court were dated Au-

gust the 25th at Larwigen in Norway, from whence they may come to Elsenore with a fair Wind in less than 48 Hours; and as the Wind has now continued for some time to blow very fair, their Majesties are expected there every Moment.

Hambourg, Sept. 4, N. S. Baron Starck, whom the Duke of Holftein has appointed to go to the Court of Great Britain with the Character of EnvoyExtraordinary, arrived here fome Days ago, and intends to fet out from hence at the latter End of next Week for the Hague, where he is to execute a Conmittion, and from thence to proceed for England.
