HE States of Holland will separate To-morrow, on Account of the Grand Pensionary's being again taken ill of the Gout. They have approved of the Report of their Commissaries employed to alter the Cahier relating to the Tax on Houses through the whole Province of Holland. The Affair of the Prince of Orance, relating to the Delivery of the Effects of the late King William, which it was thought would have been finished in this Asfembly, continues in the same State as before. The Marquess de Fenelon has dispatched by Express to his Court, the final Resolution of the States relating to the Neutrality for the Low Countries; which Resolution has been communicated to Mr. Finch and Count Sinzendorff. Letters from Constantinople of the 25th of August, which arrived at Vienna by Express, confirm the Victory the Turkshave gained over the Persians; that the latter had been entirely deseated in three different Attacks; and that publick Rejoycings have been made at Constantinople on that Occasion.
