The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Henry Earl of Pembroke and Montgomery to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Wilts, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Tuesday the Ninth of this Instant October, should be further prorogued to Thursday the Fifteenth Day of November next.

Hague, Oct. 6, N. S. The Marquis de Fenelon's Express whom he dispatched to Paris with the States last Resolution concerning the Neutrality for the Low Countries, returned hither last Week, but his Excellency has said nothing as yet to the States thereupon. M. Keyzerfeld, formerly a Minister here from the Elector of Treves, arrived some Days ago, and had this Day a Conference with the Deputies of the States, where he demanded the Payment of 150000 Florins for Arrears due to the Troops of the Elector his Master, who were in the States Service during the late War.
