Paris, November 21, N. S.

N the 29th of last Month the King of Sardinia went from Turin to Vigevano where he found the French Troops and his own drawn together. Having fent two Detachments to block up Tortona and Novara, his Majefty prepared to march towards Pavia, but before the Army moved, certain Deputies from Pavia brought him the Keys of that Town and Citadel : Whereupon the Marquels d'Aix was fent to take Pollethon of them. His Majesty advancing to Pavia, was attended there by Deputies from the City of Milan, offering to lurrender it to him : Upon which the Marquess de Coigny was sent with 9000 Men to secure that Place, to leave Part of that Detachment to block up the Caftle, and to march with the reft to pollels himfelf of Lodi. On the 7th Inftant the King of Sardinia was to leave Pavia in order to attack Pizzighitone. The Marshal de Villars arrived at Turin the 9th, and proposed to join the Army at Pizzighitone the 11th. On the 9th of this Month the Marshal Duke of Berwick took a Review of the Army he commands, in the Presence of the Count de Charolois, the Count de Clermont, the Prince of Conty, and the Count d'Eu, who are fince returned to Fontainebleau. On the 12th and 13th the faid Army repassed the Rhine, and the Troops separated to go into Quarters.

Hague, Nov. 24, N. S. Our fresheft Ad-vices from Germany are, that the five allociated Circles had taken a Refolution to raife 24000 Men for the Service of the Emperor and Empire; they add, that the French Ar-my had repailed the Rhine in order to go into Winter Quarters, having fecured their patting that River again at any Time by three Bridges and Redoubts at Fort Kehl, Hunnighen, and Fort Lewis. Our freshest Advices from Italy are, that on the 3d Inftant fome French and Piedmontese Troops entred Milan, and fecured all the Avenues to the Caftle, in or-der to form the Siege of it. The King of Sardinia and the Marshal de Villars arrived at Milan the 6th. Part of their Troops was narched towards Pizzighitone, and Part to-wards Mantua. Novara was belieged, but not Tortona. On the 16th M. des Brofles, the Saxon Minister, delivered a Letter to the States from the Elector his Master, notifying his being elected King of Poland. M. d'Ame-10ngen, Governour of Maestricht and Colo-

nel of a Regiment of Foot, having left the military Service to enter into the College of the Nobles of Utrecht, the States General have difpofed of his Place of Governour to M. Doys, Governour of the Citàdel of Tournay; and the Government of that Citadel is given to Colonel Brackel. The Prufian Minifter has, by an Order from the King his Mafter, prefented a Memorial to the States, infifting in urgent Terms, that the Archives which he has often demanded belonging to that Part of the late King William's Inheritance which is fallen to his bhare, may be forthwith delivered to him.
