Petersbourg, October 27, O.S. HIS Court has fent Orders to their Agent at Dantzick, to declare to the Magistrates of that City, that being informed King Staniflaus had defired them to raife fome Troops to affift him, her Czarifh Majefty hoped they would not comply with that Demand; for if they did, fhe should look upon such a Step as declaring open War against her ; but in case they observed an exact Neutrality in the prefent Juncture, her Imperial Majefty will order her Troops not to moleft them. Count Lynard, the Saxon Minister, has prefented to the Cza-rina a very fine Service of China made at Drefden, which the Elector his Master had fent her Majesty; and at the fame Time he made a Prefent to the Great Chamberlain of four exceeding fine Saddle-Horfes, which his Master had sent him for that Gentleman.

On Wednefday Evening Berlin, Nov. 21, N.S. last M. Poniatowsky arrived here from Dantzick : He went to Potzdam the next Day, but he has not yet feen the King, his Pruflian Majefty defigning to give him an Audience here in Town, where he is expec-ted To-morrow. It is generally thought that the Subject of that Gentleman's Commission is, to defire his Pruffian Majefty's Interpofition with the Czarina to prevent her Troops putting in Execution any En-terprize against the faid Town of Dantzick.
