Petersbourg, October 27, O. S. HIS Court has fent Orders to their Agent at Dantzick, to declare to the Magistrates of that City, that being informed King Stanislaus had defired them to raise some Troops to affift him, her Czarish Majesty hoped they would not comply with that Demand; for if they did, she should look upon such a Step as declaring open War against her; but in case they observed an exact Neutrality in the present Juncture, her Imperial Majesty will order her Troops not to molest them. Count Lynard, the Saxon Minister, has presented to the Czarina a very fine Service of China made at Dresden, which the Elector his Master had sent her Majesty; and at the same Time he made a Present to the Great Chamberlain of four exceeding fine Saddle-Horses, which his Master had sent him for that Gentleman.

On Wednesday Evening Berlin, Nov. 21, N. S. last M. Poniatowsky arrived here from Dantzick: He went to Potzdam the next Day, but he has not yet feen the King, his Prussian Majesty designing to give him an Audience here in Town, where he is expected To-morrow. It is generally thought that the Subject of that Gentleman's Commission is, to desire his Prussian Majesty's Interposition with the Czarina to prevent her Troops putting in Execution any Enterprize against the said Town of Dantzick.
