COUNT de Croy, Aide de Camp to the Marshal de Villars, has brought an Account to the King, that on the 28th of last Month Fort Gerra d'Ad-da surrendered. On the 30th past was signed a Capitulation by the King of Sardinia and the Marshal de Villars with the Governour of Pizzighitone, by Virtue of which the Garrison of that Place is to deliver it up on the 8th of this Month, and to retire to Mantua with the usual Honours of War. The Count de Broglie, Lieutenant General, having been detached the 23d past from the Camp before Pizzighitone with four Battallions and 15 Squadrons to advance towards the Oglio, and possess himself of Sabionette and Bozolo, both those Places were abandoned upon the Approach of our Troops. By the Advices we have received from Italy we reckon, that the greatest Part of the Troops which the King of Spain is to send thither are arrived, and the rest were soon expected with the Fleet from Barcelona.
