**O**N Wednesday last the Emperor held a Council of State, at which Count Charles de Konigsberg took the Oath in Quality of an actual Member thereof. Yesterday the Aulick Council declared, that his Imperial Majesty had resolved to grant the Elector of Bavaria the Investiture of his Estates, and that it would be done very shortly with the usual Ceremony. Besides the Troops that are actually marching towards Italy, Sixty Squadrons of Cuirassiers, Thirty of Dragoons, Twenty Battalions, and Eighteen Companies of Grenadiers, are to be drawn from the Hereditary Countries, which are to be replaced by the new Regiments that are raising, and which will be completed in a very short Time. It is assured that Prince Eugene of Savoy will command in Italy, and that his Equipage is getting ready, as also that of Count Nesselroodt, Commissary General of the Army.

*Hague, Dec. 18, N. S.* By the last Post from Vienna we learn, that the Emperor has refused to accept of the Neutrality for the Austrian Low Countries offered by France. The Imperial Ministers presented a Memorial last Saturday to the States. The State of War for the ensuing Year was presented on the 14th Instant to the States General, by the Council of State, in order to be transmitted to the several Provinces, and it is regulated upon the same Foot as it was for this last Year. The Marquess de Fenelon has delivered to the States, a Letter of Notification from King Stanislaus, of his Election to the Crown of Poland. A like Letter of Notification from the Elector of Saxony of his Election to that Crown, was delivered to the States a Fortnight ago. 'Tis advised from Dresden, that the Elector of Saxony taking on himself the Title of Augustus III King of Poland, set out from thence the 9th Instant, in order to go to Cracow by the way of Breslau and Tarnowitz. The States of Holland returned this Day their Assembly.
