Hague, Dec. 25, *N. S.* The Convention between the most Christian King and this State for the Neutrality in the Austrian Netherlands, was ratified by the States General last Wednesday, and exchanged the same Day with the Marquês de Fenelon, the French Ambassador. A few Days ago their High Mightinesses sent a Letter to M. Bruyninx, their Minister at Vienna, to be communicated to the Emperor, on Occasion of his Imperial Majesty's Refusal to accept the Neutrality for the Austrian Netherlands. The States of Holland separated the 23d Instant, and are to meet again on the 6th of January next, then to resume their Deliberations upon several Domestick Affairs. Count Ulfeldt, one of the Imperial Ministers, has been at Amsterdam, to give the necessary Directions for remitting to Vienna the two Millions borrowed for the Emperor at Six per Cent. upon the Revenues of Silesia.
