Hague, Dec. 25, N. S. The Convention between the most Christian King and this State for the Neutrality in the Austrian Netherlands, was ratified by the States General last Wednesday, and exchanged the same Day with the Marquess de Fenelon, the French Ambassador. A sew Days ago their High Mightinesses sent a Letter to M. Bruyninx, their Minister at Vienna, to be communicated to the Emperor, on Occasion of his Imperial Majesty's Resulal to accept the Neutrality for the Austrian Netherlands. The States of Holland separated the 23d Instant, and are to meet again on the 6th of January next, then to refume their Deliberations upon feveral Domestick Affairs. Count Ulfeldt, one of the Imperial Ministers, has been at Am-sterdam, to give the necessary Directions for remitting to Vienna the two Millions borrowed for the Emperor at Six per Cent. upon the Revenues of Silefia.
