Efterday being St. Andrew's Day, her Majefty went to Ghurch in the Morning in the Habit and Collar of the Order, with all the Knights, who had the Honour to dine with her Majefty. All the Foreign Minifters were invited to Court in the Evening, where there was a Ball and Supper.

Ball and Supper. Vienna, Dec. 26. On the 24th a Courier arrived here from Constantinople, with the important News of the Perfians having entirely defeated the Ottoman Army, and that Topal-Oiman, who commanded it, was kil-led in the Action, as also several Officers of Distinction. The Grand Signior had nominated Kiuperli, formerly Prime Vizier, to go to Perfia with all the Troops that can be drawn together, to oppose the Progress of the Persians. On the 15th Instant the Count de Preifing and the Baron de Morman, Ministers Plenipotentiary from the Elector of Bavaria, received from the Hands of the Emperor, in the Name of his Electoral Highness, with the usual Ceremonies, the Investiture of the Electorate of Bavaria, and of the Fiefs belonging thereto. The Em-perour has fince named Count Konigfegg, Vice-Prefident of the Council of War, to go to Munich with a Commission to the Elector of Bavaria. Eight Thouland Bavarians, who are in the Emperour's Pay, are to march to Hungary, to supply the Room of the Impe-rial Troops which are ordered from thence to Italy. His Imperial Majesty has conferred

upon M. Henry de Merbeck, Lieutenant Colonel of a Regiment of Cuiraffiers, the Command of the Fortrefs of Segedin in Hungary, vacant by the Death of the Baron de Weis. It is reported that the Emperour has fignified to the Pope's Nuncio here, to withdraw himfelf out of the Territories of his Imperial Majefty. According to the laft Advices from Mantua, the Garrifon of that City conlifted of Four thouland Horfe and Nine thouland Foot, belides the Garrifon from Pizzighitone, and the Place was well furnifhed with Stores of Ammunition and Provisions. It is faid, the Imperial Treafury has found out Means, and fettled Funds fufficient for maintaining the Emperour's Armics during the enfuing Campaign.

Berlin, Dec. 26, N. S. His Pruffian Majefty having taken a Journey to Potzdam, returned hither on Thursday last, after having hunted the wild Boar in the Neighbourhood of Spandau. M. Luderitz, his Pruffian Majesty's Minister at the Court of Dresden, being recalled, arrived here a few Days ago.

Berlin, Jan. 2, N. S. Count Wratiflau arrived here on Saturday laft: He waited here a few Days for Orders from his Court, which being come, he fet out Yefterday Morning for Vienna. On Wednelday laft, at Four a-Clock in the Afternoon, Major General St. Hyppolite, was put under Arreft in his own House, and the fame Evening conducted by two Captains and a Lieutenant of Donhoff's Regiment, to the Fortrefs of Spandau.
