The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day his Grace James Duke of Athol was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Thomas Lord Malton to be Lord Lieutenant of the West Riding of the County of York, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to appoint the following Sheriffs, *viz.*

Vienna, Jan. 20, N. S. General Mercy sets out the 22d Instant for Italy, where he will have an Army of his own chusing of 64000 Men. Prince Eugene of Savoy has likewise declared his Intention to serve upon the Rhine, and his Army will, it is computed, consist of 100000 Men. Baron Plettenburg, who was the Elector of Cologne's Minister at Ratisbon, is named by this Court to go to Sweden.

Berlin, Jan. 30, N. S. On Wednesday Morning last Felt-Marshal Count Wartenleben died here, in the 84th Year of his Age. We don't yet hear on whom the Government of this Town, vacant by his Death, will be conferred. The Saxon Minister notified this Morning in Form to this Court, and to all the foreign Ministers, the Elector his Master's being crowned at Cracow the 17th Instant. All our Letters from Poland affirm, that the Russians are in full March towards Dantzick. His Prussian Majesty having been desired by M. Marshall, his Cabinet Secretary, to stand Godfather to a Child of his newly born, his Majesty came to Town Yesterday to be present at that Ceremony, and returned this Morning early to Potsdam.

Hague, Feb. 2, N. S. The Letters from Cracow of the 19th past, arrived here this Evening, and bring Advice, that on the 17th the Elector of Saxony was crowned King of Poland; that the whole Ceremony was performed with the greatest Regularity, and in due Form. The Commissioners of the Admiralty, together with Admiral Sommeldyk, and some other Sea Officers, having delivered their Opinion to the States on their naval Affairs, are gone back to their respective Colleges, till further Order. The Act of Discharge prepared by the Council of State, and approved by the States of Holland, to be signed by the King of Prussia at the Delivery of the Archives, Titles &c. relating to the late King William's Succession, was delivered Yesterday Morning to M. Masch his Minister here, to be transmitted to his Prussian Majesty; and the like Act of Discharge is sent this Day to the Prince of Orange in England, to be signed by his Highness for the Delivery of his Part of the late King William's Effects. Orders were this Day dispatched to all the Regiments in the Service of the States, to have their Troops and Companies compleat by the 25th of March, and to be in Readiness to march if there be occasion.
