ftands prorogued to Tuesday the Fourteenth Day of May next: We do for that end publifh this our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby diffolve the faid Parliament accord-ingly: And the Lords Spiritual and Tempoingly: And the Lords Spiritual and Tempo-ral, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgefles, and Commiffioners for Shires and Burgefles, the Houfe of Commons, are difcharged from their Meeting and Attendance on Tuefday the faid Fourteenth Day of May next. And, being defirous and refolved, as foon as may be, to meet our People, and have their Ad-vice in Parliament, do hereby make known Will and the Houfe of Peers in the faid enfuing Parliavice of our Propie, and have then Ad-vice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all our loving Subjects cur Royal Will and Pleafure to call a new Parliament; and do hereby further declare, That, with the Ad-vice of our Privy Council, We have this Day given Order to our Chancellor of Great Bri-tain to iffue out Writs in due Form for calling a new Parliament, which Writs are to bear Tefte on Thurfday the Eighteenth Day of this Inftant April, and to be returnable on Clerk Register, or fuch two of the principal Thursday the Thirreenth Day of June next.

For Diffolving this prefent Parliament, and In Order for the Electing and Summoning declaring the Calling of another.

WHereas We have in Council thought fit to declare our Pleafure for fummoning and holding a Parliament of Great Britain on Thursday the Thirteenth Day of June next enfuing the Date hereof : In order therefore for the electing and fummoning the Six-teen Peers of Scotland, who are to fit in the Houfe of Peers in the faid Parliament, We do, by Advice of our Privy Council, iflue thisour Royal Proclamation, ftrictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to afthe Houfe of Peers in the faid enfuing Parlia-ment, by open Election, and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then prefent, and of the Proxies for fuch as shall be absent, Clerks of the Selfion as thall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby re-spectively required to attend fuch Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes, and immediately after fuch Election made, and duly examined, to certifv
