Whereas the Toyshop of Anna Markham, adjoining to St. Dunstan's Church in Fleet-street, London, was, in the Night between the 13th and 14th Day of May Instant, robbed of several Goods wrought in Gold and Silver, to the Value of about Three Hundred Pounds: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robbery, is pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the Criminals who shall discover his Accomplices, so as they or any of them be apprehended and convicted thereof.

A. a Pair of Tongs, Strainer, &c. near four Dozen of Gold Rings, some plain, but most set with Stones of several Sorts, six Pair of silver Spurs, two Dozen or more of Gold Seals set transparent and otherwise with Cornelians, Chrystals, and other Stones, some ditto set in Metal gilt, a Parcel of shagreen Pocket Books with Gold Mountings, and ditto with Silver, an old Gold Thimble, a Pair of small Woman's Gold Buckles, some Sweet-meats Knives, in Tortoiseshell inlaid, Pearl, Silver, &c. three or four Dozen of gilt and silver Thimbles, a Pair of large Garnet Sleeve Buttons set in Gold, a Pair of ditto with Chrystals and Cyphers set very strong, 30 or more fine Snuff-boxes, consisting
