Turin, June 2, N. S.

HE two Armies continue still in the fame Pofture, and by the Ac-counts from the French Camp, it appears that the Imperialists had not yet made any Motion towards Parma. The Report of the Finalese having revolted against the Republick of Genoa is confirmed, and that the Innabitants throughout the whole Marquifate of Final had fet up a Standard with the Arms of France, Spain, and Sardenia.

Hambourg, June 15, N.S. The Danish Court returned on the 12th to Altona, accompanied by the Margravine, who had been at Aurich to Le her Daughter, and affilt at the Marriage of the Hereditary Prince of Oftfrile with the Princels of Bareith ; the Celebration whereof has concluded with a Mourning, occafioned by the Death of the reigning Prince. M. Brackel, the Ruffian Mini-fler, received Advice by a Staffette on the 11th, that the French Ships were returned from Dantzick into the Road of Copenhagen, and had brought with them a Ruffian Frigate of 32 Guns, and three Merchant Ships of other Nations, taken about the Height of Pillau, laden with Ammunition for the Ruf-Upon this Incident, he prefenfian Camp. ted a Memorial Yesterday to the Council, reprefenting it as an Act of Hostility contrary to the Kelervation which the King of Denmark made in Favour of his Allies, when he allowed the French the Ule of his Ports; and therefore reclaiming his Danish Majesty's Allistance against them as Enemies and Aggreffors. The Court has returned no Answer yet, but an extraordinary Council was held in the Afternoon, at the Conclusion of which a Courier was difparch'd to Copenhagen. The three Merchant Ships, one of which is English, having been unladen, were immedi-ately released. These Ships bring Advice, that the Ruffian Squadron, conlifting of about 20 Sail of different Sorts, is actually before the Mouth of the Vistula. The Émperor having granted a Neutrality to this Town in Favour of their Trade, they are now railing the Contributions with all Speed for the Service of his Imperial Majefty and the Empire.

Hague, June 18, N. S. The States of Holland have this Day refuned their Allembly. By Letters from the Rhine which arri-ved here Yesterday we have Advice, that the Duke of Berwick was killed the 12th by a Cannon Ball in the Trenches before Philips-The fame Letters add, that the Garbourg. rilon having opened the Sluices, which overflowing the Trenches, 500 French had been drowned therein; and that Prince Eugene decefs of Culmbach Bareith.
