The Place of Fiscal of the Court of Justice is given to the Advocate Bisdome; the Regiment of Horse Guards to the Count de Bentheim; and the Count's Regiment of Horse to Brigadier General de Lynden; the Regiment of the late Prince of Nassau Ziegen to M. Boisfroux, who was Lieutenant Colonel of the same. According to the Advices we have received here from the Rhine, the Imperial and French Armies lie observing and cannonading each other. We received some Days ago from Paris, an Account, printed by Authority there, of a long and bloody Battle fought near Parma on the 29th of last Month, between the Imperialists commanded by Count Mercy, and the Allies by the Count de Coigny, which Account makes the Loss of the Germans to be 9 or 10000 Men, and that of the Allies not half that Number. We have not yet any authentick Accounts from the Imperialists; but there are Letters of the 3d of this Month from Mantua, which say the Imperialists had indeed about 10000 Men killed or wounded, but that the Loss of the French amounted to 15000.
