THE 26th Instant the King of Prussia came from Wesel to General Ginkel's Country Seat in Guelderland, where he dined and lay that Night, and the next Day he set out for Cleves, and in all Probability will not come into Holland. The Day for the Assembly of the States of Holland is not yet fixed, and it is generally believed they will not meet till the Middle of next Month. The Honourable William Finch, Esq; his Britannick Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary to the States General, is preparing to take his Audience of Leave of their High Mightinesses, and to embark forthwith for England. According to the Advices from the Rhine of the 23d Instant, Prince Eugene was with his Army near Schwetzingen; and the French Army being divided into two Bodies, the largest under the Command of the Marshal d'Asfeld was encamped near Fort Louis, and the other under the Marshal Duke de Noailles was posted near Raftadt.

His Majesty having been graciously pleased by his Warrant under his Royal Sign Manual, dated the 10th of June, 1733, to establish certain Rules and Orders for the better Government of the Charity for Relief of poor Widows of Commission and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy; These are to give Notice to all such Widows as aforesaid, whose Husbands died on or since the 30th of August, 1732, that Copies of the said Rules and Orders are lodged with the Commissioners of his Majesty's Navy at Chatham, Portsmouth, and Plymouth, and also with the Clerks of the Cheque at Deptford and Woolwich, and with the Naval Officers at Harwich, Deal, and Kinsale; where they may be informed of all Particulars which entitle such Widows to the Benefit of the said Charity, and receive the proper

And the Court of Assistants do hereby give Notice, that they shall meet at this Office on Tuesday the Tenth of September, at Eight of the Clock in the Morning, to receive and adjust the Claims of all such Widows as shall be qualified according to the said Rules and Orders.
