IS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, SirCharles Dalton, Gentleman-Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meflage from His Majefty to the Houle of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

An Act to punifs Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act to indemnify Perfons, who have omitted to make and subscribe the Declara-tions contained in the Act of Uniformity of the thirteenth and fourteenth Years of King Charles the Second, within the Time limited by Law, and for allowing further Time for doing thereof.

An Act for repairing the Roads from the Town of Manchester (leading through Newton, Failfworth and Oldham in the County

And to two private Bills.

Warfaw, March 17, N. S. Count Bra-niski and the Commillaries fent to the Palatin of Kiovy, arrived here on Monday last; they confirm that every thing is settled with him and his Army, and that he is now Re-

gimentary of King Augustus, with Promise of being made Great General at the first Dyet; the Number of Troops that remained under his Command are in all about 5000, and he only waits Orders from this Court how to difpole of them. In Confideration of the Palatin of Cracow's having quitted his Pretentions to the great Generalship, he has obtained a Penlion to the Amount of 60,000 Dollars a Year. By the last Accounts from the Palarin of Volhinia, though he pretended being inclined to make his Peace with this Court, and had assured the Palatin of Kiovy that he would conform to whatever Refolutions he took, he is march'd with his Division to join M. Poccey in Lithuania. Wo have News of the Palatin of Lublin's having attack'd a fmall Garrison of 300 Men the Saxons had at Karga, very near the Frontiers of Silefia, and the fecond Day the Saxons wanting Powder, capitulated to be fent to Pofen, having had only one Man killed and one wounded.

Berlin, March 26, N. S. We have re-ceived Advices, that the Poles are retired from Zeulichau, Oblat, and Croffen, but whither these Advices do not mention. The King of Pruffia defigned to remove from hence to Potzdam on Thursday last, but was prevented by Accounts of the unhealthy Situation of the Place, feveral of the tall Gre-nadiers having lately died there of a malig-nant Fever. The Hereditary Prince of Brunf-wick came hither on Thurfday laft, in order to fetch the Princels his Confort.
