Berlin, April 19, N. S.

Deputy is arrived here from Mecklenbourg, with Complaints against the Prussians that remain in that His Prussian Majesty's Country. Legs begin to swell again; and the Incision which was made in the Left and healed up, has opened of it self. Prince Lichtenstein being come to Town, we hear that his Prusfian Majesty has given him the strongest Asfurances, that the Prussian Auxiliaries shall, without fail, joyn the Imperial Army by the 4th of next Month.

Hague, May 2, N. S. On the 28th past the Prince of Orange set out for Guelderland. He dined with M. Catwyk at his Country Seat three Leagues from hence, whither the Princess Royal was invited, with Teveral Ladies of Distinction, and the Entertainment was very magnificent. In the Evening the Prince proceeded on his Journey, and the Princess Royal came back hither. Yesterday the Marquess de Fenelon, Ambassadour from the most Christian King, returned hither from Paris. The States of Holland separated to Day, and are to assemble again to Morrow Seven-night. To Day the Princes Royal is gone to see Leyden.
