M. Munck, Chamberlain to his most Serene Highness the Duke of Wolfenbuttel, who was sent hither on the Part of his said Highness, to compliment the King on his late Arrival in his German Dominions, had his Audience of Leave Yesterday, and set out this Morning to return to his Court, well satisfied with his Reception here. Yesterday Morning about Nine a-Clock, his Majesty, attended by the Regency, and a great many of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction, went on Horseback from Herrenhausen to a Plain near this Place; where the three Troops of Horse Guards passed in Review before his Majesty: They performed the Exercise both on Horseback and on Foot, and then went through their several Firings. His Majesty was pleased to express his entire Satisfaction with their Performance and fine Appearance. M. Von Johnn, Resident from the King of Denmark, arrived here Yesterday in the Evening from England; as did likewise M. Alt, Secretary from the King of Sweden as Landgrave of Hesse Cassel, and was this Evening introduced to the King at Herrenhausen by the Marquess de la Forrest, Grand Chamberlain of his Majesty's Household.
