ON Wednesday last in the Evening M. Borcke, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Prussia, arrived here from England. On Thursday his Majesty finished the reviewing of the Regiments separately that are cantoned in this Neighbourhood; and this Morning he made a general Review of the whole, together with the Regiments of Horse and Foot Guards, upon the Ecker Camp, and was pleased to express his entire Satisfaction with the fine Appearance the several Regiments made, and also with the great Exactness and Regularity of the Performance of their Exercise, Evolutions, and Firings.

Dublin, June 11.

This being the Anniversary of His Majesty's happy Succession to the Throne, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out on Oxmantown Green. At Noon their Excellencies the Lords Justices, met at the Castle and received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
